William Boone Douglas Jr., 83, a retired Foreign Service officer who later worked for a newspaper, died Friday at his home in Charleston, S.C. He had cancer.

About 10 years ago, Mr. Douglass moved from Washington to Charleston, where he lived with a niece, Alvira D. Zirkle.

He was born and reared in Washington and graduated from Eastern High School. He served in the Army in World War I.

In 1922, he graduated from Cornell University. He joined the Foreign Service later that year and subsequently was assigned to Spain, India, Mexico, Santo Domingo and the Philippines. He was U.S. consul in Athens, Greece, for several years before retiring in 1950.

After moving to Charleston, Mr. Douglass worked as a proofreader for the Charleston News and Courier for a number of years.

He was a member of the Order of Magna Carta.

There are no immediate survivors.
